

MULTIDISCIPLINARY EUROPEAN ENDOVASCULAR THERAPY



The MEET 2005 Congress gathered **598 delegates** in Cannes from June 9 to 12, 2005, at the Martinez Hotel. The audience was mainly made of European physicians and industry representatives (94%), as shown on figure 1.






A majority of confirmed physicians (60%)




An unrivalled multidisciplinary audience

For 86% of attendees, the primary reason for attending the MEET 2005 Congress was either to update their overall knowledge in the field of vascular therapy (60%) and to learn more about one particular technique, potentially the endovascular technique, (26%).

In parallel, 8% of delegates attended the MEET 2005 as a first time introduction to peripheral endovascular procedures.




A success in fulfilling the participant's goals




The audience was asked to grade the different aspects of the scientific programs. Results are illustrated in the **figure 7**.

Lectures by MEET Faculty Members were assessed as "Excellent" in 42.5% and as at least "Good" in 95%. The two items that gathered the less enthusiasm are the quality of the final program (6% thought it was poor) on one hand and of the abstracts (10% judged them as "Poor") on the other hand. During the MEET course, video and live demonstrations were evaluated of at least good educative quality in 92%, as were scored the discussions periods.




The vast majority of MEET attendees stated that the endovascular treatment (98%), risk factors management (91%), evidence based practice (88%), and diagnostic investigations (83%) were at least "Important" in their practice. Thus they were willing to learn in priority about new therapeutic potentials (assessed as at least "Important" for 98% of them), new diagnostic modes (for 95%), to learn about new devices (for 94%) and endoluminal grafts (for 89%) as shown next page.
